Music Ministries

Adult Choir

The adult choir is open to parishioners and community members who are age 16 and older. The ability to read music is helpful, but not necessary. The choir rehearses on Thursday evenings in the church from 7:00 to 8:30 PM and sings the 10:00 AM Mass every Sunday, from the week after Labor Day until Pentecost. In addition, the choir sings for the Evening Prayer for the Dead on the first Sunday of November, Christmas Eve, 10:00 PM Mass, Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday Liturgy, Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday, 10:00 AM.

Cantors

The ministry of Cantor is more specialized and requires a larger commitment than the Adult Choir. Cantors sing on a rotating basis at

all weekend liturgies at St. Clarence and rehearse with the music director during the week.

Children's Choir

The Children's Choir is an academic year ministry that is open to all children of the parish and community in grades 2 through 8. The Children's Choir begins the second week of PSR and sings for 3 weekend Masses in the fall and on Christmas Eve at the 4:30 PM Mass. The Children's Choir continues in the spring singing for 4 weekend Masses, concluding with the 12:00 Mass on Mother's Day.

Funeral Choir

The Funeral Choir sings for all funerals and memorial Masses. Anyone may be a member of the funeral choir. Members should arrive one half hour before the funeral begins to receive information about what will be sung and to have any last minute rehearsing of new music or to hear special announcements concerning the liturgy that day.

Ministry of Care:

The Ministry of Care at St. Clarence parish is comprised of trained, committed volunteers who reach out to the homebound, lonely and infirm in our parish. Ministers will bring the Eucharist to those who request it and they ensure that requests for the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick are conveyed to the pastor. They provide friendly visits on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis offering hope, compassion and caring. Ministers also help those whom they visit connect back with the community of St. Clarence so that they have opportunities to contribute to the life of the parish.

Prayer Shawl Ministry:

Shawls and lap blankets are used for more than keeping warm. They are symbols of caring and compassion. These handmade shawls and blankets may help the person feel loved and remembered. Members of the Prayer Shawl Ministry prayerfully knit and crochet shawls which are given to people in the community who may be going through life changing events. These shawls/lap blankets may be given to persons suffering from a chronic illness or are struggling with a physical or emotional health issue. A new mom or a child who is ill or hospitalized may benefit from a shawl/lap blanket. The shawl/blankets from this ministry are distributed through the Parish Office during regular business hours.

Members of the Prayer Shawl Ministry meet on the third Wednesday of each month from 12:30 PM – 2:30 PM in a classroom at the parish. Members do not need to be present at meetings. Several of our members work at home to complete their work. Yarn and other supplies are available through the ministry. New members are always welcome.

Religious Readiness - Sunday Morning Ages 3 - Kindergarten

Our Religious Readiness program helps your child grow in faith and a relationship with God. Children, ages 3 to Kindergarten, are introduced to the Sunday Liturgy through scripture, prayer and activities. A variety of fun, age-appropriate learning methods are used to enhance young children's faith experiences, including music, story-telling, drama and crafts. We love helping young children experience a warm community in church and allow parents time to be restored by their own experience of prayer.

Religious Readiness meets from September through May during the 10:00 am Mass and we accept registration through December. A calendar and registration can be found on the St. Clarence website.

Drop off and Pick up: Children begin Mass, seated with their families. They are then invited to leave the Mass prior to the First Reading and are brought to Religious Readiness by their leaders. All children are to be picked up immediately following the Mass by a parent or guardian. Classes are located in the lower mezzanine.

First Timers: If a child is apprehensive about attending for the first time, a parent or guardian is welcome to accompany the child.

Visiting St. Clarence: Children who are guests or visiting St. Clarence are welcome to Religious Readiness. Ask a Greeter or the Religious Readiness volunteer in the atrium for a guest form prior to Mass. Complete and return the form *before* the child joins a group.

Children's Liturgy of the Word - Grades 1 and 2

Children in Grades 1 and 2 are invited to break open the Sunday Scripture in an age-appropriate way with a volunteer leader each week at the 10 am Mass. Families sit together at the beginning of Mass. After the Opening Prayer, the priest and the Children's Liturgy of the Word leader gather the children at the front of the church and kids are led to St. Kevin's Chapel. After the homily, children will return to the church and sit with their families for the remainder of the Mass.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is held from September to May following the same calendar as Religious Readiness. There is no registration.

Religious Education - PSR

In addition to Mass, Faith Formation (PSR) for children in Grades 1 – 8 who do not attend a parochial school is on Monday during one of two sessions: afternoon or evening. PSR runs September through May. A calendar and registration can be found at style="color: blue;">styl

Sacraments

Children who are attending the PSR program or are enrolled in a parochial day school are invited to celebrate the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion during their 2nd grade year and Confirmation during their 8th grade year.

Children Ages 1-2 - Co-op Nursery

Families with children ages 6 month to 3 years old are invited to take part in the Mass Time Co-op Nursery during the 10 am Mass. The Nursery will provide parents with care for their children so they can enjoy more full and active participation in Mass. Please complete an online registration for your child which can be found on the St. Clarence website or contact Grace Kincaid to learn more about this ministry.

Other Worship Opportunities

Eucharistic Adoration:

The Eucharist is available for Adoration every Friday during the liturgical year. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed after morning Mass from 9 am – 7 pm.

We also have the recitation of The Divine Mercy Chaplet and the Rosary every Friday at 3 p.m.

The Blessed Sacrament is exposed for Adoration in sequence with the Church's liturgical year at St. Clarence Parish. During the seasons of Advent and Lent, The Eucharist is exposed Monday – Friday, in the St. Kevin Chapel, from 9 a.m until 7 p.m. Sign-ups for a weekly Holy Hour during these seasons occur after all Masses the weekend prior to the beginning of Advent and Lent.

All are welcome to participate in Eucharistic Adoration and/or sign up for a weekly Holy Hour at any time during the year.
